


Survey and Certification Review Results

TILL recently completed our agency-wide **Survey and Certification** in June 2017 and received a two-year license and certification. We are proud to share a few highlights here:


- TILL's commitment to growth and service enhancement since the last survey was highly evident.


At the invitation of Grainne Close, National Director of the Autism

Joining the speakers were three members of the TILL group; each spoke of challenges overcome and their pride in their accomplishments. The travelers were warmly welcomed by Lord Mayor Nuala McAllister with a Civic Reception at the historic Belfast City Hall and a personalized tour.

Exploring the Belfast area with our new friends from AINI, we were awestruck by the Titanic Museum, the Giants Causeway, and Dunluce Castle; we relaxed at the local markets and pubs, and explored a beautiful park inspired by C.S.
